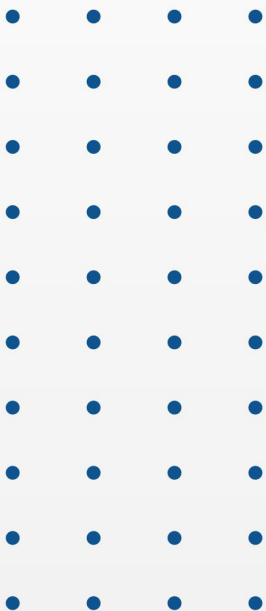
Executive Summary

Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra (SMKK) is a non-profit, non-political voluntary development organization, established in January 1996 and working since the inception of the organization, it has been implementing integrated development projects/programmes with the poorer section of the community with particular focus to address the rights of children and women for bringing a positive change in their livelihood. Over time SMKK has gained experience and capacity by working on various development issues with technical and financial support from multifarious donors. It has gained a significant institutional competency to implement larger initiatives for achieving development objectives.

SMKK has a team of 384 staff and volunteers who are well qualified and experienced to project implementation of livelihood, vulnerable group development & empowerment for wider adoption by its target beneficiaries, thus enabling them to attain improvement of livelihood standard. The organization has so far been involving over 4,90,065 people through development initiatives presently being implemented.

SMKK strongly believes in target population concept for its basic development efforts in which the focus is the destitute and disadvantaged poor with emphasis on children and women. The organization follows regular monitoring, feedback, sharing experiences and immediate action for the successful implementation of the projects/programmes. It is dedicated to foster qualitative and quantitative improvement in the living standard of the target beneficiaries.

SMKK has a policy to work in that area where the people are comparatively more vulnerable. Its programmes specially targeted to ensure its support to establish rights of the women, adolescent girls and children to remove social injustice and bring a society free from discrimination.

SMKK is governed by two-tier governing body and general by body governance system. The basic governance lies with the governing body of SMKK. It comprises of 7 members, including the Executive Director of the organization as an ex-officio member. Mr. M. Manjur Kadir is working as Executive Director. In addition to the general body there is an executive committee which is assisted by advisors.

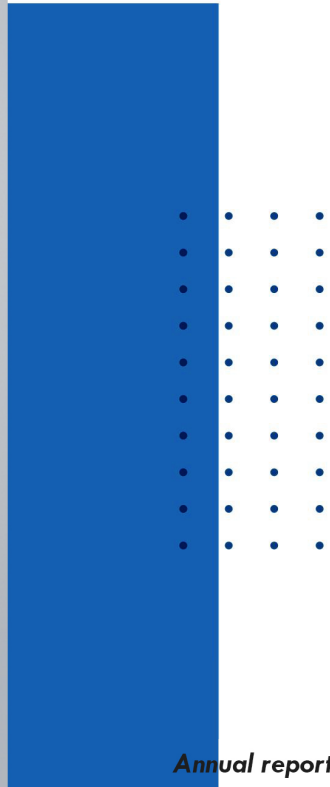

Human Resource Development /Capacity Building

During the report year, SMKK organized different Human Resource and skill development training for the beneficiaries to increase their basic awareness, knowledge, behavior, attitude and entrepreneurship. Well designed training materials (mostly visual) were used for the target recipients and practical sessions were organized for the skill development training. SMKK hired some experienced resource persons

from other organization besides its own training personnel. Regular mentoring and extension support and in some cases refresher training was organized for the beneficiaries.

- Provided Entrepreneurship Development Training to 25 Entrepreneurs.
- Provided Training to 20 Community Facilitators on facilitation and psychosocial treatments.

- Provided Training to 05 staffs on Gender and Development
- Provided foundation training for 10 staffs on good facilitation, occupational health and safety (OHS), Personal Protective Equipment using etc.

Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Response and Humanitarian Sectors

SMKK's mandates to quick response to any types of disaster occurred in operational areas. During the reporting period January 2020 to December 2020 SMKK mostly concentrated on Disaster Risk Reduction and Emergency Response, Humanitarian related activities through different projects with the funding and technical supports of various donors and partners.

- Developed 11 Upazila Based Disaster Preparedness Committee (UDPC) and provided orientation to 70 volunteers response against Super Cyclone Amphan.
- Formed 10 Protection Watch Committee and Provided Training on disaster risk reduction issues i.e. land slide, earthquake and cyclone preparedness.
- Formed and Functioned 5 adolescent clubs with boys and girls and provided training to 100 volunteers on disaster preparedness.
- Provided Shelter kits/House-hold strengthening Kits to 1000 HHs
- Excavated and re-excavated 13 drainage channel
- Constructed 20 Pipe/ring culvert and 6 micro dam
- Provided emergency supports (Health, Wash, protection, solar energy and non-food items distribution) to 115275 Rohingya Refugees of Cox's Bazar.

- Planted and cherished 1000 coconut trees

Human rights, Women Empowerment, Good Governance, Disability Supports and Gender Development Sector

As a humanitarian organization SMKK always emphasized on human rights, women empowerment, good governance and Gender development issues in its every single program.

- Provided orientation training to 10 staffs 20 Community Facilitators on human rights, women empowerment, good governance and Gender development issues.
- Ensured women participation in every event/programs
- Established 10 women and child friendly spaces and sensitized on GBV issues
- Prioritized PWDs and WWDs in selection its clients/beneficiaries in the committee or groups
- Distributed assistive devices i.e. walking sticks, wheel chair, hearing device, glasses to the 500 PWDs and WWDs.
- Formed 5 adolescent clubs and 20 Watchdogs with women leadership
- Established 'make-up corner' and providing make-ups materials especially for adolescent girl, female children and women.
- Provided Training to 180 Adolescent girls on family planning, personal hygiene, child marriage, human trafficking, Girls education etc.
- Organized/celebrated International Human Rights day and Women's day.

Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET)

Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) is one of the prioritizing areas of SMKK. During the period SMKK provided Technical and Vocational training on different Trades/Occupations under various projects.

- Provided Technical Training on Mobile Phone Technician (MPT) to 60 Un-skilled youth
- Provided Technical Training on Beautician (BTC) to 90 un-skilled and un-employed youth.
- Provided Technical Training on Tailoring/Sewing to 190 un-skilled and un-employed youth.
- Provided Technical Training on Basic Computer to 120 un-skilled and un-employed boys and girls
- Provided Technical Training on House Wiring Electrician to 40 un-skilled and un-employed youth.
- Provided Technical Training on Sewing Machine Operator (SMO) to 40 un-skilled and un-employed youth.
- Organized Work Place Based Training (WBT) for 270 un-skilled and un-employed youth.
- Wage based job placement for 150 graduates from different trades
- 100 youth Self-employed in different occupations i.e. Mobile phone technician, Beautifications, Tailor and Computer operators.
- Organized 2 Financial Linkage program for the Entrepreneurs to ensure financial supports for the graduates.
- Organized Training on Labor Rights and Decent Works for the employers of informal sectors.

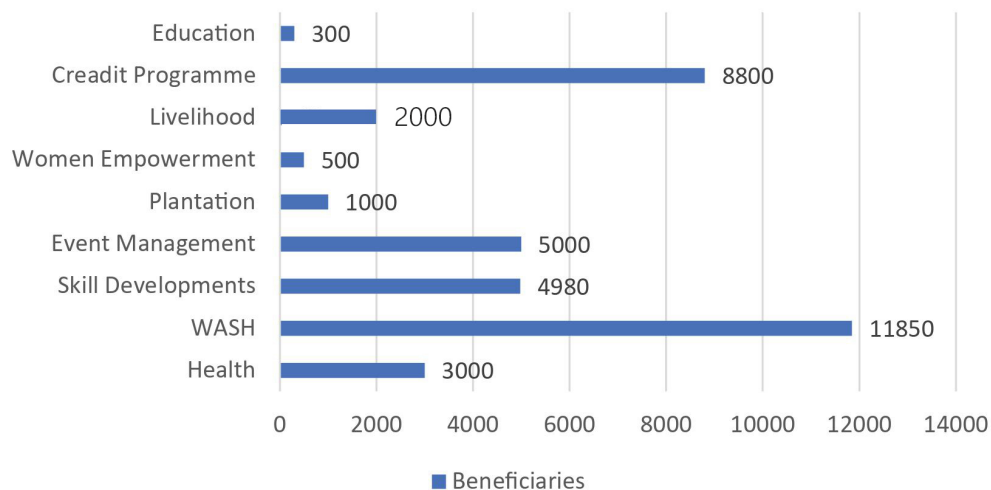
SMKK covered 96,580 beneficiaries in 2020 and aims to serve 120 thousand beneficiaries next year.

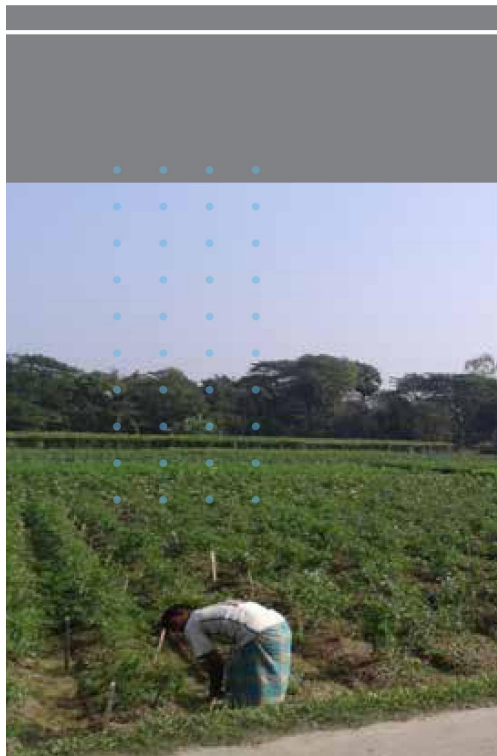

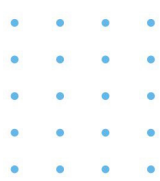

CONCLUDING WORDS

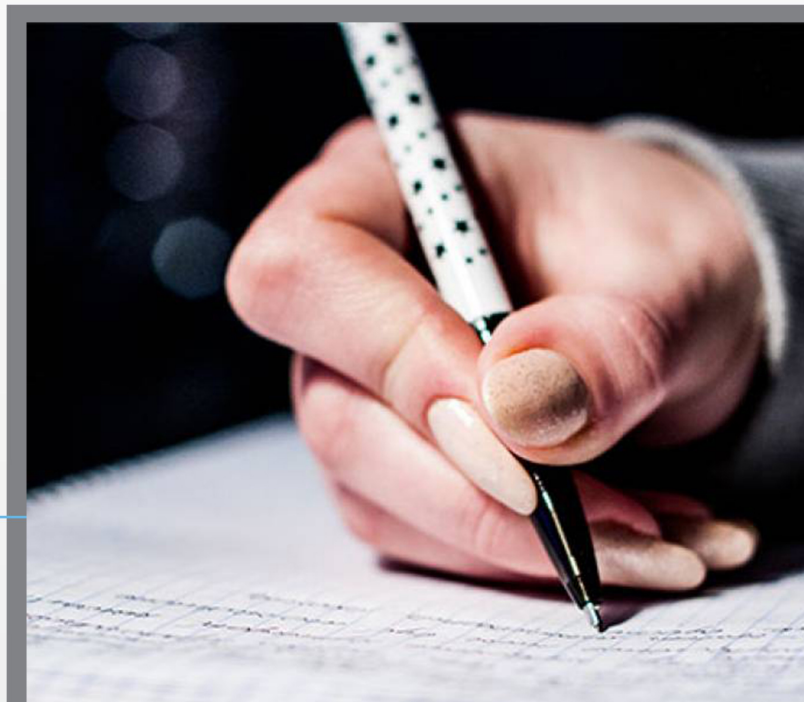

It is possible to be protected from the corona virus if people are aware
-Said Shah Alam

Shah Alam- age 58, is living in Hatimura, Rajapalang Union with 9 members of his family. He lives with his family members about one km away from the market. He has first heard about the corona virus through the television news. He was shocked to know that so many people had died through the corona virus, and he began to think about how to get rid of the virus. The local people have suffered a lot from allowing Forcible Displaced Myanmar National to live in Ukhia Upazila, and the epidemic has left them even more worried.



He learned about some of the steps to stay free from the corona virus through the television and tried to follow it. He told his family and neighbors to wash their hands regularly, wear masks and maintain social distance. He advises her customers who come to his grocery store to stay free from the corona virus. But in the market where he had his grocery store, there was no hand washing system. There was a small bucket filled with water in the front of his shop but most customer could not wash their hands because the bucket was small. He was very happy to hear that a hand washing device would be installed by the Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK, Funded by -Muslim Aid-UK in their market and he expressed interest in overseeing this hand wash device. He has helped a lot in installing the hand wash device and regularly he is filling the



water drum. Advises customer who come to the market to grow the habit of hand washing. He said to read the messages to protect against corona virus attached to the hand wash device and advised to be aware about the Corona Virous. He showed the rules of hand wash to the customer, who came to the market.

He thanked Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK on behalf of all the vendors in the market. He also thanked Muslim Aid-UK for funding the project.

Zahura said- what would have happened to us without you?

Zahura Khatun - age 28, lived in the village of Bujasang in Myanmar. While living in Myanmar, her husband cut down trees and farmed to support her family. In October 2017, Myanmar's military burned down their homes, for saving their lives, they left their land and has come to Bangladesh 5 days walked with their 8 days-old child and became completely destitute and took shelter like others in Ukhiya in Bangladesh.



If we were a little sick in Myanmar, we would have to pay



about 600 Burmese currency for medical treatment, which is often not available. And now since coming to Bangladesh we have been getting food and shelter as well as medical services. Inside the camp, Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK has its medical health post, if we all the family members will sick, we can take free medical services from this Health Post. We don't have to go far. My neighbors including me are getting medical services from the same Health Post. "We women get a lot of security because we don't have to go to any medical center far away," Zahura said.

Due to the high density of the camps, we are afflicted with various diseases such as diarrhea, dermatitis, cold and fever. "We don't have money so we can't go to any doctor outside the camp for a health check-up," She said. With SMKK having this Health Post, me and my neighbors can all take free doctor prescription and medicine.



The Burmese government has expelled us from this country, my husband doesn't do much work, he often beats me up and Doesn't take any care. Thank you for your support and assistance in this situation

He let out a sigh and said, "May Allah keep you well for the rest of your life."

On behalf of him and all his neighbors, she thanked Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK. She also thanked Muslim Aid for providing funds to run the medical center.



Zahanara Khatun is happy to get Qurbani meat from SMKK

Zahanara Khatun is wife of Late Monohar Seikh. She is widow. She has four (4) members in his family including his son's wife and children. His son is an agricultural labourer and his income is very low. The family lives on the income of Jahanara Khatun's only son. She manages her family with great difficulty. and he is constantly struggling with poverty.



Problem:

Because of poverty, it is not possible for him to Qurbani or even buys meat on the day of Eid.

Response:

Muslim Charity provided 2 kg Qurbani meat to Zahanara Khatun through Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK for enjoy Eid with his family joyfully. By eating the meat of this Qurbani, all the members of Zahanara Khatun's family will meet the demand for nutrition.

Quotes from beneficiary:

I am Zahanara Khatun. My Husband's name is late Monohar Seikh. I live in Kanchanpur village of Sadar upazila of Kushtia district. I am a Widow. We are 4 family members. I am very happy to get 2 kg of Qurbani meat from Muslim Charity through SMKK. We cannot Qurbani for poverty and we didn't get Qurbani meat from anywhere else. We thanks to Muslim Charity for providing the Qurbani Meat. We pray to Allah for donor as well as Muslim Charity. We expect others help, including Qurbani meat, every year.

Amina Khatun is getting the safe drinking water benefit from the installed tubewell by SMKK funded by Penny Appeal and she cultivating vegetables.



I am Amina Khatun. I live with my husband and children in Patilapara village of Baraid union in Saturia upazila of Manikganj district. My daughter is read in class three. Our home is in a field quite far from the locality. Here we have 3 families in 2 houses. We had no source of safe water for drinking. We have little land where we cultivate vegetables and sell the market to make a living.

But due to lack of irrigation, vegetables would not be produced well. Due to lack of money we can't install a shallow tube-well.



Now SMKK has installed a shallow tube-well in our home premises funded by Penny Appeal. Now our water crisis is solved and we can irrigate the vegetable fields.



We are very much happy and pray to Allah for donor for supported us. We are really grateful to SMKK and Penny appeal. **Amina Khatun, Tube-well Usurer.**

From today, I will raise awareness about the corona virus to my own family and neighbors– Said Zaheda

Zaheda- age 15, lives in Purba Dhegholia village with a family of eight members. Her father is a day laborer by profession. He studied in 10th class in Dailpara High School. The distance from the school to her house is about 3 km and their house is located about 5 km away from the Upazila headquarters.



Her home is in a remote area from the Upazila Sadar, they did not know about the corona virus at first. Her school has been closed for about 9 months due to the pandemic corona virus. He first knows about the corona virus through his neighbor. At first, she was very scared. She did not know how to survive this pandemic. But she learns through her neighbors and on television that she needs to wash her hands regularly.

She has learned a lot by the participating in the COVID-19 awareness session which is organized by the Sheba Manab Kallyan Kendra-SMKK and She is very happy to get 5 pcs Mask, 5 pcs. Soap and 1 pc. Hand sanitizer from the SMKK. She says they can't afford to buy masks, soaps and hand sanitizers because her father is a day laborer.



She and her classmates all are very happy that such activities are being conducted in their school. Zaheda said she has gained a lot of knowledge by attending this awareness session and from now on she and her friends will make their family members and neighbors aware of the corona virus.
